What you will be doing	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Attend a half day induction training 2. Helping or delivering presentations and talks to local groups and individuals to seek funding, ask for volunteer assistance and engage further support for our cause 3. Attending cheque presentations 4. Actively networking through personal connections or local opportunities. 5. Attending community group meetings and events. 6. Spreading the word about our services and volunteering opportunities. 7. Acting as an advocate for NRC
Skills, experiences and qualities required	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Good verbal communication skills. 2. Ideally, previous experience of networking. 3. Ideally experienced in the use of audio visual presentation tools. 4. Ability to generate network opportunities to meet with key potential supporters. 5. Team player, able to work in close partnership with the NRC team. 6. Respect for the diversity of our colleagues and clients. 7. Willing to work within our values, procedures and policies. 8. Friendly, reliable, approachable and a confident team player.
